





No words. Just great sadness. Just deep fear. Emerging anger.


This is their future. This is Earth's future. Extinction. This is their failure to thrive.



















Previously, a sharp battle ensued between forces for a selfish future and forces for a thriving future. No longer. **Extinction!**, movie and book, changed all that.

At the edge of extinction, came change. Forces of selfishness lost hold. Fear lost hold. Disillusionment lost hold. Division lost hold.




Forces for avoiding extinction start to win more elections in democracies. They rise to power in non-democracies.

And so, in the end, did they choose well?


Did they choose a path far better than their extinction path? Did they choose the path leading to their surviving? Not to extinction. Many wanted the selfish path, but did they prevail?

It had begun to wither. It had begun to die. Not slowly as humans thought. But quickly. Very quickly.


Too quickly for humans to seek or find a new home. Another planet. Too quickly to escape.

There is a problem with air they breathe, the water they drink, and the food they eat. No longer do these sustain the animals.


They wither. They die.

Quick to the market. Met by people pale with despair. No food. Maybe tomorrow.


Too many people. Too little food. Today hunger. Tomorrow starvation will rob many bodies of life.

Why was I even there? No one had come to work for over a week.


For a few days, phones rang from anxious employees who couldn't make it to work but didn't want to lose their jobs and livelihood. Even those calls stopped.

Back then it was almost midnight here in the middle of the north Atlantic. We had assurances it would be a safe crossing.


As I stood on the open deck, I vaguely saw many large spots of white in the dark night. Icebergs. Couldn't be. Not that many.

The Thrive! Endeavor



Now it is destroying us. Not slowly. But with the speed and vengeance of a dear friend or lover that we deeply wronged.


Food almost gone. Water almost gone. Air almost gone.

Riots. Wars. Death and more death.


Even less air, food and water. And then there would be none. And then we would be none.


We will not breathe. We will starve. We will die of thirst. And then we will be gone.

Some of our leaders come out quickly and call for big change. Some have yet to come forward. They huddle in their offices deciding what to do.


The President is silent. Unusual to be silent. But his selfishness and shortsightedness far exceeds that of everyone else.

Long dormant halls are quickly coming alive. Members and staff are rushing in with a new sense of urgency. A new sense of purpose. The world must avoid extinction.


So long since it has fulfilled its founding and noble purpose, the United Nations must finally and definitively lead and act.

Three Nobel scientists.


We huddled over one powerful computer. We scanned and analyzed data over and over again. We looked at each other. Despair. It became clear to us that we were in midst of a global catastrophe.

From the Oval Office looking out at the Washington Monument, I saw no hope. I failed. We failed.


What had happened had happened so much faster than anyone predicted. Still, we should have known. We should have acted. We failed.



Finally, it is fulfilling its founding and noble purpose. United Nations definitively leads and acts.



So wrong. Back then, little sun made it through the dark skies. Little solar energy being generated. Batteries almost depleted.


I was wrong. I would just last a little longer than some.

They come to the barn for food as they began to starve. They feared.


For weeks back then, the farmer did not come to feed or milk them. There was no milk because there was almost no feed.



Since we opened the gates of the White House grounds, more and more families are bringing their children to play.


Children bring so much joy to what has been far too stately a place. Now it is a playground. Now it is a symbol of America's future. Of the world's future.

The days of one party rule of any country have passed. Many more of our people help govern. Now we experiment with new forms of government that focus on what is best for our people, all our people.


Led by many of our youngest leaders, this new government has already made many improvements. More to come.


Air is very good. Water is very good and plentiful. Food stores are fully stocked. Every Chinese has enough to survive and thrive. That is the right answer.

Escaping extinction at all costs. Achieving and sustaining a thriving future at all costs.


Lessons learned just in time
